This grant provides the matching funds for a federal grant awarded to the Alameda-Contra Costa Transit District (AC Transit) in February 2008. The project lays the groundwork for AC Transit to determine the feasibility of establishing a mobility management structure (a coordinated transportation system) within its jurisdiction, by identifying and cataloging all transportation resources in the East Bay to foster coordinated transportation services.

AC Transit will identify and catalog all current transportation providers (public, private and nonprofit) within its designated service area. The assessment takes into consideration all available resources, including senior centers, medical facilities and senior residential facilities, whether their primary function is transportation, education, daycare, medical serve, nutrition or providing other community human services. The project will result in the creation of a database and identification of options to create a coordinated transportation system for seniors and disabled people.

Alameda County

Alameda County's half-cent transportation sales tax, known as Measure B, will generate more than \$3 billion over 20 years for transportation improvements in Alameda County. Over **\$150 million** is dedicated for **Special Transportation for Seniors and Disabled**. In voting for Measure B, which dedicated 10.5 percent of the sales tax revenue to paratransit projects and programs, Alameda County residents voiced their support for increasing mobility for seniors and people with disabilities.

To date, through four grant cycles, ACTIA's paratransit grant program has funded 52 capital projects, programs, and master plans totaling \$9.1 million.
