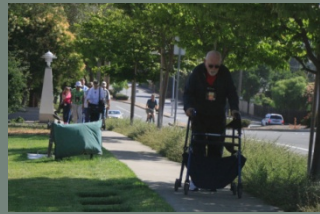


Special Transportation Services for Individuals with Dementia Project

North/Central/South Counties

The transportation program accommodates the special transportation needs of individuals with moderate to late-stage Alzheimer's disease or dementia. Alzheimer's Services of the East Bay (ASEB) is revising transportation routes to accommodate the growing need for programming in communities that ASEB services. The program currently provides services in Berkeley, Hayward and Oakland, and is expanding within the City of Oakland to allow more efficient transportation for more individuals in Oakland's five districts.

The program will provide additional transportation services Monday through Friday for individuals with dementia. This ACTIA grant funds the operation of six vehicles daily (including four additional vehicles funded by ACTIA in 2006).



PROJECT BENEFITS:

With the addition of the five Oakland districts, ASEB provides an added 1,200 one-way rides per month and supports an additional 110 caregivers of individuals with dementia.

PROJECT UPDATE:

To date, ASEB has provided transportation services for over 90 individuals with dementia and provided over 13,000 one way trips over 125 days of service.

Alameda County

Alameda County's half-cent transportation sales tax, known as Measure B, will generate more than \$3 billion over 20 years for transportation improvements in Alameda County. Over **\$150 million** is dedicated for **Special Transportation for Seniors and Disabled**. In voting for Measure B, which dedicated 10.5 percent of the sales tax revenue to paratransit projects and programs, Alameda County residents voiced their support for increasing mobility for seniors and people with disabilities.

To date, through four grant cycles, ACTIA's paratransit grant program has funded 52 capital projects, programs, and master plans totaling \$9.1 million.
