The Alameda County Transportation Commission is a newly-formed countywide transportation agency, resulting from a merger of the Alameda County Congestion Management Agency (ACCMA) and the Alameda County Transportation Improvement Authority (ACTIA). Its mission is to plan, fund and deliver a broad spectrum of transportation projects and programs to enhance mobility throughout Alameda County. This merger will eliminate redundancies and create efficiencies in planning, programs and project delivery and streamline legislative, policy and funding efforts.

### *About PAPCO*

PAPCO is a community advisory committee to the Alameda CTC Board made up of paratransit consumers. PAPCO meets monthly to address funding, planning, and coordination issues related to ADA-mandated and city-based paratransit services in Alameda County. This year's workshop reflects priority issues identified by PAPCO and its Technical Advisory Committee.
