PROVIDING LOCAL improvements in the Baywood area of Unincorporated Alameda County, this project will help alleviate traffic congestion and reduce regional bypass and cut through traffic on numerous arterial, collector and local roads.

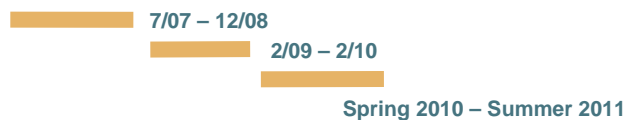
THE PROJECT may include:

- Installing dual westbound left turn lanes on Castro Valley Boulevard at the intersection with Mattox Road/Foothill Boulevard.
- Converting the west end of Norbridge Avenue from one-way to two-way traffic. Modifying traffic signals along Castro Valley Boulevard at John Drive and Stanton Avenue.
- Constructing capacity improvements along Castro Valley Boulevard at various intersections.
- Assessing the new circulation patterns within the Baywood area once implementation of above

STATUS UPDATE:

In July 2005, the ACTA Board adopted Amendment No. 1 to the 1986 Expenditure Plan which deleted the Route 238 (Hayward Bypass) Project and added four projects, including this project.

On May 9, 2006, the Alameda County Board of Supervisors endorsed a list of potential projects in the Baywood area for use of Measure B funds.

In June 2007, the ACTA Board approved a Project Specific Funding Agreement with Alameda County for the scoping phase. ACTA and Alameda County staff are working together to finalize this funding agreement; upon completion, work will begin.
