

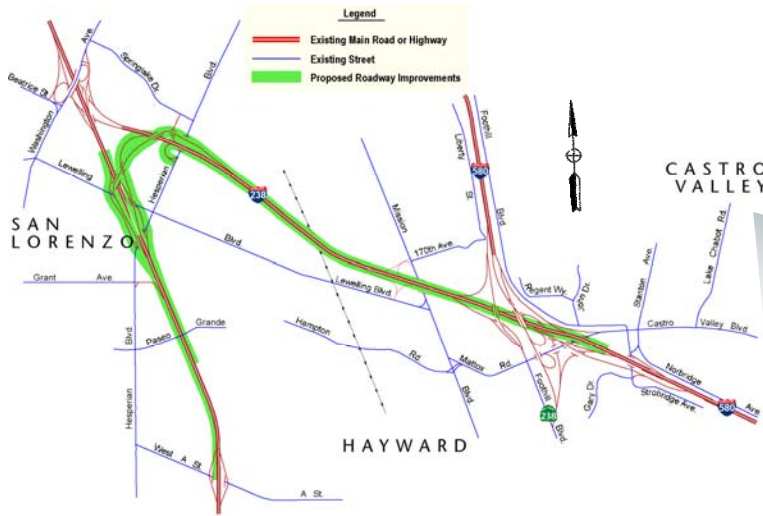
I-238 Widening

Improving Regional Mobility and Freight Movement

Central Alameda County



INTERSTATE 238 serves as the single east-west freight connector between the Port of Oakland and California's agricultural heartland. Today, this corridor experiences congestion almost 24 hours per day, impacting regional traffic and freight movements.

THE PROJECT WILL:

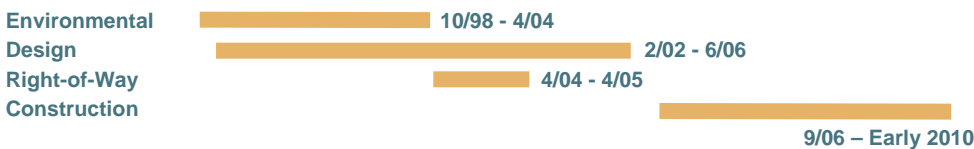
- Widen I-238 between I-580 and I-880 from four to six lanes
- Add auxiliary lanes between local access interchanges—on I-238 between I-580 and I-880; on northbound I-880 from Hacienda Avenue to I-238; and on southbound I-880 from I-238 to A Street
- Reconstruct the northbound I-880 to southbound I-238 connector



STATUS UPDATE:

Construction of this critical corridor began in Fall 2006 and is anticipated to be completed in 2010.
