

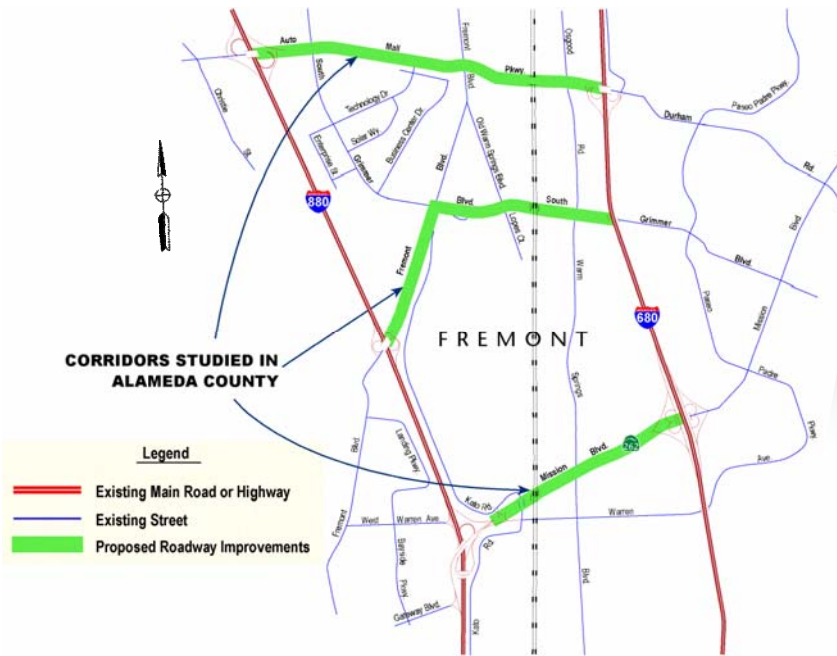
# I-680/I-880 Cross Connector Studies

Gap Closure, Local Congestion Relief

## South Alameda County



**S**UDYING CONNECTIONS along six corridors between I-680 and I-880 in Alameda County and in Santa Clara County resulted in a program of improvements on the corridors to provide gap closure between two interstates as well as local congestion relief. Potential improvements include road modifications, intersection specific improvements and traffic system management options in one of three corridors in Alameda County: Auto Mall Parkway; Fremont/Grimmer Boulevards; and Mission Boulevard (Route 262).

**STATUS UPDATE:**

In 2001, the SCVTA led a study to investigate alternatives for potential I-680/I-880 cross connections. The final report was completed in June 2005, and recommended a program of improvements in Alameda and Santa Clara counties. The next step is to develop a Project Study Report (PSR) for an Alameda County Project, which ACCMA is leading.

Improvements along route 262 (Mission Boulevard) between I-680 and Warm Springs Blvd will be evaluated.
