**Public Hearings to be Held on the East-West Connector Project
Draft Environmental Document**

Fremont and Union City, CA – The Alameda County Transportation Authority (ACTA), in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the cities of Fremont and Union City, will hold public hearings on the Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for the East-West Connector Project on January 14th in Union City and January 15th in Fremont. The purpose of these public hearings is to provide the public with an opportunity to comment on the DEIR.

“Public hearings for the East-West Connector Draft Environmental Impact Report are an important part of our public involvement process,” said Arthur Dao, ACTA deputy director. “We look forward to hearing from the public and responding to their comments in the Final Environmental Impact Report.”

The East-West Connector Project is a 3-mile roadway project that would provide more direct east-west access between Interstate 880 (I-880) to the west and Mission Boulevard to the east in southern Alameda County. The proposed project would achieve this objective by widening existing portions of Decoto Road and Paseo Padre Parkway and constructing a new roadway from Paseo Padre Parkway to Mission Boulevard. The proposed project also would provide other infrastructure improvements along its entire length; for example, a continuous bike and pedestrian corridor from just east of I-880 to Mission Boulevard.

The primary objectives of the proposed project are to reduce local traffic congestion and travel time and to provide a more direct east-west link in the transportation network in Fremont and Union City. More specifically, the project would benefit the community by:

- Improving air quality by decreasing local traffic congestion
- Implementing planned transportation improvements upon which completed and planned developments in Fremont and Union City depend
- Improving access to transit facilities and businesses in the vicinity
- Improving transit operations in the vicinity by reducing congestion along existing and future transit routes
- Promoting the use of non-motorized transport
- Maximizing the use of public right-of-way in the Historic Corridor for transportation purposes

PUBLIC HEARINGS

ACTA is holding two public hearings to receive comments on the DEIR. The public hearing format will include an open house where project team members will be available to assist the public with review of the project displays, a brief presentation, and facilitated public testimony period. At any time during the public hearings, members of the public can provide formal comments on the DEIR verbally to the designated court reporter, during the public testimony period, or in writing on comment sheets provided. Formal responses to comments will be provided in the Final Environmental Impact Report. The same information and opportunity to comment will be provided at each public hearing.
